IMPORTANT NOTICE: In the event that a special election is called by the Governor to fill a vacancy in the State Legislature, the notice and candidate filing period requirements for a **state election** will apply to all entities located in the county or counties included in the affected legislative district. Resolutions for elections to be held on the same date as a state election must be submitted to the County Election Board no later than 75 days prior to the election, and a candidate filing period, if needed, must begin no later than the 10th day following the deadline for submitting the resolution to the County Election Board.

* Regular or special elections involving candidates may only be scheduled in February, April, September, and November in an odd-numbered year. The filing period for any regular or special election called by a school or technology center district or by a statutory or home rule charter municipality must begin no later than the 20th day following the deadline for the election resolution to be submitted to the County Election Board.

⁺ A municipality with population in excess of 250,000, according to the most recent federal census, is permitted to hold an election conducted by the County Election Board on the second Tuesday in December in odd-numbered years. No other entity may hold an election in December conducted by the County Election Board.
