Next week more than 400 municipal delegates from cities and town across Oklahoma will be in Tulsa to participate in the 103<sup>rd</sup> Annual Conference and Exposition for the Oklahoma Municipal League (OML). The event will feature educational programming designed to better equip municipal officials with the skills they need to effectively govern and manage Oklahoma's municipalities.
