Over 100 Oklahoma Mayors Will Gather In Guthrie For the 7th Annual Congress of Mayors

(January 18, 2017) Mayors, City Managers and City Council Members from across Oklahoma will meet at the Scottish Rite Masonic Temple in Guthrie on January 20th to debate issues facing municipalities and craft a legislative agenda for the 2017 legislative session.

The Oklahoma Congress of Mayors is sponsored by the Mayors Council of Oklahoma (MCO) and the Oklahoma Municipal League (OML). Congress delegates will attend the one-day mock legislative session to discuss municipal issues, participate in the legislative process, and ratify resolutions that will be presented to the governor and legislative leaders. A priority topic this year is the diversification of municipal funding. Other topics of concern include public safety, economic development and maintaining local control.

Former State Representative Joe Dorman will be serving his seventh term as parliamentarian. “I am delighted to serve these municipalities in formulating their agenda for the upcoming legislative session,” Dorman, said. “The Congress of Mayors is an important annual event that helps municipal officials and lawmakers work closely together to serve their constituents. I am honored to be a part of this annual event.” Mr. Dorman serves as a town council member in Rush Springs and is the CEO of the Oklahoma Institute for Child Advocacy.

Guymon Mayor Kim Peterson said “It is my privilege as President of the Mayors Council of Oklahoma to invite you to attend this event. Mayors from across the state will converge on the first capitol of Oklahoma for a day of discussion to become informed, involved and exercise the power of local government in the legislature. In the upcoming legislative year cities and towns are going to experience a continued effort to weaken local control and sales tax issues are among the issues in the crosshairs for the next year.”

Weatherford’s Mayor and Oklahoma Municipal League’s Board President Mike Brown said, “This is a great opportunity for Mayors from across the state to come together as ‘one voice’! I encourage all Mayors and Vice Mayors to attend the Congress of Mayors and be a part of the process.”
