BEING INFORMED – HAVING A VOICE

Why you should join OMUP:

- A clear voice at the legislature and with the public to assure that municipal water issues are understood and addressed.
- Up-to-date information through emails and DRIP GRIPS on water issues, regulations and unique ways of how other communities are dealing with their water issues. These go to all OMUP members to email addresses that they designate (can be several per municipality).
- Coordinated work to meet new EPA and ODEQ regulations.
- For the DWSRF alone, Oklahoma cities and towns will need \$5.4 billion in new infrastructure over the next 20 years. Cities and towns need to work together for REAP grants, CDBG, the Revolving Loan Fund and Rural Development to let our legislators know that these programs are essential for infrastructure and economic development in Oklahoma communities.
- Developing a workable program for ODEQ rulemaking to implement water reuse and other efficiencies for water management in Oklahoma.
- Educational workshops and networking opportunities. Including an annual Water/Environmental Summit. Check the OML website, www.oml.org for details on this year's summit!

We hope that you will join the Oklahoma Municipal Utility Providers (OMUP) to help your community and to support fellow municipalities with current issues.
